What does MAP for FAM mean?

The Ministry Action Plan (MAP) is a strategic tool designed to help church leaders evaluate their current ministry philosophy and take intentional steps toward aligning it with a Family Advocacy Ministry (FAM). While FAM can be lived out by individuals, churches, or entire communities, this particular MAP is tailored for **church leadership**. This workbook was designed to work through as a leadership group.

This workbook offers a step-by-step guide to help you assess where you are, identify your best next steps, and cast a compelling vision for the future.

We are facing a real crisis—but the good news is, everyone can do something. Lasting change will take all of us. And together, we can be part of the solution.



Action Plan Work Pages

A Ministry ACTION plan requires some ACTION! Here is how we hope to guide you towards ACTION.

MISSION & VISION

The mission and vision at the heart of your church shape your ministry philosophy. Keeping them central ensures clarity and direction for every step forward.

ASSESS

This assessment is designed to help your church evaluate how your current ministries engage with the work of family advocacy and identify opportunities to engage more intentionally.

SUMMARIZE

By using post-assessment reflection questions, you can identify strengths and gaps for your church that align with your mission and engage in Family Advocacy Ministry.

SET GOALS

What are clear next steps you can take? This will help you plan for clear communication as well as help the 111Project staff know how best to support your work and your Family Advocacy Ministry!

Overlaying the Lens of Family Advocacy

Now that you've taken inventory of the ministries your church offers, it's time to assess them through the lens of Family Advocacy Ministry. This perspective helps identify how your church may already be serving vulnerable children and families—and where new opportunities might exist to deepen that impact.

In this exercise, you'll review each ministry area to consider how it currently supports—or could be realigned to support—those in need of family advocacy. On the next page, you will find a list of activities/ministries that could be considered under the umbrella of FAM.

It would be helpful to discuss the questions below to explore and maybe discover what all is already taking place at your church.

Reflection Questions to discuss as a team:

- Are we already serving foster, adoptive, or kinship families?
- Do we know the vulnerable families in our community who need early intervention and support? How do we know?
- Where do we see untapped potential in our current ministries to serve children and families in crisis?



FAM Examples

Family Advocacy Ministry encompasses a broad range of efforts that can serve various populations, before (hopefully preventing), during, and after foster care. Here are some areas where your church could or might be engaging.

Before

Prevention & Early Support

- **Child abuse prevention efforts** - equipping children and caregivers to prevent or identify early signs of abuse or neglect
- **Parenting, marriage, or support classes/groups** - offering practical tools and encouragement through addiction, mental health, and relational struggles
- **Financial literacy or job programs** - helping families build stability in their finances
- **Meal trains** - for families in stressful seasons (new placement, hospitalization, crisis recovery)
- **Transportation help** - rides to work, appointments, or court dates
- **School-based engagement** - backpacks, school supplies, uniforms, tutoring/reading

During

Advocacy & Awareness

- **Hosting info nights** - foster/adoption/kinship awareness events
- **Recruiting & training foster families** - in partnership with local agencies
- **Speaking at churches or community groups** - to grow understanding

Foster & Biological Family Support

- **Wrap-around care teams** - providing meals, babysitting, house cleaning, yard work
- **Foster/adoptive parent respite events** - fun, safe activities for kids while parents rest
- **Prayer partners** - committing to regularly pray for specific families
- **Care packages** - placement welcome kits for kids entering care
- **Holiday support** - gifts, events, or experiences for foster/adoptive families

Engagement with Child Welfare

- **Caseworker appreciation & encouragement** - snacks, handwritten notes, events
- **Meeting emergency needs** - cribs, clothing, food cards delivered quickly
- **Visitation room makeovers** - making agency spaces warm and child-friendly

After

Community-Based Restoration

- **Family reunification support** - mentoring, furniture donations, job support for parents regaining custody
- **Housing support** - providing or helping people find or furnish safe housing
- **Job networking and training** - connecting parents to employment opportunities
- **Mentoring or life skill coaching** - walking alongside parents, aging-out youth, or kinship caregivers
- **Supporting adoptive families** - recognizing that the support of the church doesn't end post adoption

Ministry Area Mapping

*CarePortal can be utilized in 3 different ways:



- Meet Community Needs – Agencies post needs and churches respond directly.
- Use Community Resources – Churches can claim donated items or funds to meet needs.
- Share Church Needs – Submit needs for anyone connected to your church—physical or relational.

Assessing Resources for FAM

Every community has valuable resources the church can connect with—both physical and relational. These may include tangible supports like a clothes closet, food pantry, or benevolence program, as well as relational networks such as mentoring programs, support groups, or community volunteers. Use these pages to brainstorm potential partners who can help meet needs through both practical provisions and meaningful relationships.

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How Our Team Can Support Your Church

1. Training & Equipping

- Provide workshops, sermons, and small group resources to help congregations understand the call to care for vulnerable children and families.
- Equip ministry leaders with best practices for launching and sustaining Family Advocacy Ministry (FAM).

2. Coaching & Consultation

- Offer one-on-one coaching for pastors and ministry leaders.
- Help churches assess their current ministries and identify natural on-ramps for FAM.

3. Tools & Resources

- Share assessments, workbooks, and guides (such as the MAP for FAM).
- Provide access to platforms like CarePortal to connect church members with real-time needs in their community.

4. Vision Casting & Communication

- Partner with church leaders to articulate a clear vision for FAM.
- Share stories and testimonies that inspire and mobilize the congregation.

5. Volunteer Mobilization

- Help churches recruit, train, and organize volunteers for family advocacy efforts.
- Support leaders in creating sustainable systems to engage members long-term.

6. Collaboration & Partnerships

- Connect churches with other congregations, nonprofits, and agencies working toward the same mission.
- Foster collaboration rather than duplication of efforts.

7. Prayer & Spiritual Encouragement

- Pray with and for church leaders and their congregations.
- Encourage churches with reminders of God's heart for children and families
